1. Helen:
 - Presentation style/verbal is great
 - Spoke to audience
 - Made it personal – how it relates to you – very smart
 - Going through spaces was organized, well done
 - Pendant explanation in lobby was well done
 - Not sure about colored light behind reception desk, but does get their attention over to there
 - Fitness center – ceiling blue by choice or interior design? Consider highlighting the blue? Coves? Column lighting? Space height? Direct /indirect idea should work. What do you want to see in the glass?

2. Shawn:
 - Great engaging presentation, humor was good
 - Intro to building and setting it in context was good but maybe invert colors of floor plans to show contrast for non engineers
 - Lobby – clear focus, didn't let other areas distract from main goal
 - Kept referring back to “big picture” – good
 - Design was kept simple and very real – practical and doable.
 - Didn't really talk about mood/feelings of the spaces – bring personal experience into this part
 - Fitness center – bring blue ceiling into design more – incorporate the architectural choices – blue wall outside at night might be nice
 - Incorporating color changing was for a reason and not because it's “cool” – interesting idea and much appreciated.

3. Lee:
 - Could take more liberty with color than some of the other spaces.
 - Speak a little slower, but the excitement is good
 - Change graphic background or text, the combination is a little hard to read
 - Arrows into the space would help to analyze the plan – refine needs for presentation
 - Drop ceiling-puncture of ceiling ok but square holes and round pendants – doesn't fit
 - Whats above the floating plan in terms of light? What can be done with that? – make more of the space – bring it to life and push it further

- Be more creative with reception task light – more glow, light the side of the desk?
Bring people to the counter- translucent?
- Concession – say “sales” instead of “advertising”
- “productivity” doesn’t fit the space characteristics
- Too big a deal of the server’s side than customer side
- Show both the spaces in 1 – perspective on perpendicular
- Whats going on in the corridor to transition?
- Light the worker’s face
- Recessed indirect may be too much light
- Fitness center – if energy savings is the most important, list it first
- Cove, skylight, blue sky above, mirrors, etc
- Show photosensor control on drawings
