Barbara Horton:

- Great Ideas
- Too Many Notes – takes away from lighting part
- Present metaphors as images
- Great rendering techniques
- Lots of Technical Questions
- Blue grays (?)
- Screen detail idea – may not work well for residences
- Introduction too long
- Lobby – Sections would have been more helpful
 - Trouble understanding glowing glass wall
- Parking Garage – would LEDs be visible? Doesn't think it would be from far away – waste of money
- Don't say anything is ugly
- Wood wall (16th-17th floor) – big difference between computer rendering and sketch – choose 1 (computer is better) but don't use both. Smaller grain on wood
- Questionable glow for wood – maybe use front lighting
- No artwork will be on it (hypothesis)
- Skylight glass detail (over reception) – put all on 1 slide. Detail won't work out as I would have liked it to.
- Cove detail heat issues with wood
- Use Jasmine pencil to identify light rays
- Façade – white plenums? Better chance at getting mullion light with color than interior – won't bother people
- Use 4 or 5 different ideas for façade lighting and decide from there

Lee Waldron:

- IO Lighting – great solutions for lighting glass – LEDs
- Parking garage – light end walls & have it lead to lobby rather than just lighting lobby
- Skylight detail – put source lower – glass won't glow anyway, reverse source
- Façade – get best play from top – make it a landmark – emphasis
- Garage rendering – lighting bigger spread than realistic
- Look at parking garages to see how the floor levels and cars will affect spill light outside
- Cathedral Image on slides – draws attention, has nothing to do with lighting. Use something more relevant.
